

Captain Warren D. Judge



Captain Warren D. Judge reported as Commanding Officer of Coast Guard Training Center Cape May, N.J., in July 2022. Annually, he oversees the military basic training of approximately 3,800 new Coast Guard men and women.

In his previous assignment, he served as the ESD Chief in Portsmouth, Va., for the Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Cyber and Intelligence Service Center, leading 226 military and civilians and 500 contractors in innovative engineering and standard processes utilizing the System Engineering Lifecycle. Previously, Capt. Judge was the executive officer of the Command, Control, Communications and Engineering Center in Portsmouth, Va., and the executive officer at the service's second largest base at Base Elizabeth City, N.C.



As Career Management Branch Chief for the Office of Personnel Management, he provided career management advice to more than 8,000 officers. As operations officer at Electronic Systems Support Unit New Orleans, he responded to Hurricane Katrina by leading teams rebuilding the service's lower gulf coast command and control infrastructure. He was also the Assistant Operations Officer and Law Enforcement Officer at Group Mobile, Ala.

From 2009 to 2012, he served as a Presidential Response Officer communications lead for President Barack Obama at the White House Communications Agency as the only Coast Guardsman. While there, he traveled to locations such as Moscow, Shanghai, Seoul, and Dublin as well as many cities in the United States, supporting communications for the executive staff.

Capt. Judge is 1986 graduate of Coast Guard recruit training with company M-123. Subsequently selected for the Pre-Commissioning Program for Enlisted Personnel in 1995, he completed his bachelor's degree in Computer Science at Elizabeth City State University, N.C., in 1997. He earned his master's degree in Computer Science from Howard University in 2004 and a second master's degree in System Quality Management from National Graduate School 2007.

Capt. Judge's military awards include Department of Defense and three Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medals. His educational accomplishments include completing the Center for Homeland Defense and Security Homeland Security Executive Leaders Program and being awarded the 2021 Coast Guard's Black Engineer of the Year. He attended Harvard University, John F. Kennedy School of Government Executive Education for Cybersecurity. He also received the 2013 Elizabeth City State University Chancellor's Legacy Leadership award for the military.

A native of Tampa, Fla., he is married to the Angela Judge, née Brown, and has two adult children and three grandchildren (the fourth arriving September 2022). He is an avid racquetball player.
