Ombudsman are bound by a strict code of confidentiality. ONLY the following topics will be communicated to command, ALL other topics will remain CONFIDENTIAL.

- All suspected or known situations of child abuse or neglect
- Alleged domestic abuse
- Suspected or potential homicide, violence, or life endangering situations
- All suspected or known suicide risks
- Any criminal activity
- Any severe financial issues

Housing Information

Should you be assigned to TRACEN Housing here are some things to know

Housing office: Monday – Friday, 7:30 am – 4 pm; 707-765-7145

Moving in but your Household Goods (HHG) haven't arrived yet? We've got you covered with Aloha Boxes.

We have things to help get you settled until your Household Goods arrive! Boxes include: pots, pans, silverware, cups, dinnerware, children's cutlery, plates and bowls and other essentials.

Per housing manual, the following are not permitted in housing:

Trampolines, Fire Pits, Electric Scooter, Hoverboards, Electric Skateboards, Swimming pools (kiddie pools less than 12" in depth are approved), hot tubs, spas, inoperable / project vehicles, home built play sets (i.e. swing sets, jungle gyms, playhouses, tree houses, etc.). Personally owned play equipment is *DISCOURAGED* but must be commercially purchased and <u>shall not</u> be anchored in cement.

Pets – Barnyard or exotic species are strictly prohibited, as are the following (or mix of) breeds of dogs: Pit Bulls to include American Pit Bull Terrier, American Staffordshire Terrier, Staffordshire Bull Terrier, as well as Rottweiler and Chow breeds. Any dog displaying the majority of physical traits of any of the above breeds, or dogs exhibiting those distinguishing characteristics which substantially conform to the standards established by the American Kennel Club, are prohibited.

Electric vehicles – Housing Manual states electrical services are not to be used to charge personal vehicles.

Firearms- Personal Firearms are permitted in government owned housing. ALL Firearms MUST be registered at TRACEN Police Department. Firearms CANNOT be fired or discharged anywhere on the TRACEN base.

Please note: Generators ARE permitted and can be very useful during potential outages. Renter's Insurance is highly encouraged for all on base tenants.

Housing Guests

Guests are welcome to stay in housing at any given time. However, the following guest visit guidelines must be followed based on the length of visit. To sponsor an international guest, you need to give security at least 30 days advance notice.

For guests staying 13 Days or less:

Security open 24 hours

If guest is driving their own vehicle, resident MUST notify security gate in advance of guest arrival. A visitor request form can be dropped off or faxed to the Main Gate Fax #

Front Gate

Over 14 days:

Must contact housing office to gain approval for Guest Authorization Request.

707765-7818. It is not necessary to advise housing office.

Over 30 days:

Must obtain written approval from Commanding Officer. Contact housing office for additional information.

Guest lodging at TRACEN has 13 available rooms. There are 5 VIP rooms with a combination of a suite with one king size bed, small microwave & refrigerator combination, private bath, cable TV, coffee maker and maid service every day.

Neighborhood Advisory Board

The purpose of the Neighborhood Advisory Board (NAB) is to help meet the objectives and goals of the CG Housing Program, community services, and the Command by effectively managing the family housing resources at TRACEN Petaluma while meeting the inherent needs and recreational preferences of the assigned families.

The NAB serves as a collective body of residents of Family Housing, the Housing Office, Engineering Maintenance, Fire and Police Departments, the Morale, Well-Being & Recreation (MWR) Division and the Ombudsman. The Board identifies and assists the Command in prioritizing projects, initiatives, programs, and activities to improve family housing and community living. The NAB also addresses upcoming community events and how to bolster involvement, addresses any issues with maintenance in housing, and addresses any issues with enforcement of regulations and responsibilities in housing.

All housing units have an active duty NAB member who represents (and lives) within their zone. For questions, concerns, and meeting dates please speak directly with your zone representative. If you do not know your zone representative, contact the housing office.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION

You are required to have liability coverage on your vehicle. If you do not have proof of insurance in your possession or do not have insurance, you will not be allowed to drive your vehicle onto the base. You will be required to park your vehicle next to the Pass and ID building until you can show proof of insurance.

The vehicle does not need to be registered in your name, but your name must appear on the insurance policy. You will need a copy of the Rental Car agreement.

Those driving motorcycles must contact TRACEN Police Dept. for requirements before driving on base.

GAS STATION



General Description:

The Boys & Girls Club (BGC) of USCG Training Center Petaluma is housed in the Community/Teen Center facility located aboard TRACEN. The facility is on Pennsylvania Avenue across from the Lakeside Recreation Picnic Area/Park. This BGC is offered through the Coast Guard's Petaluma MWR branch under Youth Services.

This BGC offers a variety of programs that support eligible dependents from Kinder to 12th grade. Eligible dependents are outlined in the MWR Manual. These programs are separated into two programs: a Youth Program & a Teen Program. The Youth Program is offered for all dependents Kinder to 6th grade and follows the Two Rock Union School District's calendar year. The Teen Program is offered for all dependents 6th - 12th grade and follows the Petaluma City School District's calendar year. Parents/guardians of 6th graders between the ages of 11-12 have an option between the two programs. This is in recognition of the ranged development seen within these two years, as well as the program support needs of parents/guardians. Those wishing to place their 6th graders between the ages of 11 & 12 within the Teen Program must first contact the BGC/Youth Services Director.

Youth Program:

The Youth Program consists of a Mon-Fri after school program and seasonal camp sessions. The after-school program is offered at no cost and includes a snack/drink for each child. Additionally, the Youth Program offers seasonal kids camps during school breaks with full day hours of operation: Spring Break, Summer Break, Thanksgiving Break, and Winter Break Camp. The camp sessions are offered for a fee and do not include meals. The Youth Program also offers extended after school program hours as needed.

Teen Program:

The Teen Program consists of a Mon/Thu/Fri after school program with evening hours after the Youth Program concludes. The after-school program is offered at no cost and includes a snack/drink for each teen. The Teen Program also offers a summer camp, which features multiple field trips each week during summer break around the local community and popular tourist attractions. The field trips are offered at various fees or at no cost depending on the field trip.

Registration and Attendance:

There are separate registration forms for the Youth/Teen after school programs and seasonal camp sessions. Registration must be completed and received by the BGC before any child or teen is allowed into the program. The after-school programs are drop in/drop out and do not require sign ups to attend after registration, unless otherwise indicated on the schedule of events. Seasonal camps require registration and sign ups in advance.

Hours of Operation/Additional Information:

Hours of operation for the Youth and Teen programs, detailed program information, and current calendars can be found by contacting the BGC/Youth Services Director. The BGC is closed on Federal Holidays.

*Please note: Due to COVID-19 some programs may not be available



PGE.com** – Stay up to date on scheduled power outages in the summer. Due to our high temperatures and high winds during the summer months PG&E can potentially secure power to prevent wildfires.

**If you live on base, when checking these websites, you MUST enter the base address, to get accurate information: 599 Tomales Road, Petaluma, CA 94952. Entering your personal address on base will result in error.

Ready.gov - Is a national public service campaign designed to educate and empower Americans to prepare for, respond and mitigate emergencies. It is full of useful information, such as how to talk to your kids about emergencies & natural disasters, how to prepare an evacuation plan, what to pack in a go bag and knowing *when* to evacuate.

CDC.gov – Is the nation's health protection agency, their website has a wealth of information regarding public health and safety, as well as resources on disease prevention and personal protective equipment, such as DIY face masks and personal hygiene guidelines.

IF YOU ARE ORDERED TO EVACUATE:

In the event of a fire or other emergency were to displace you from your home, military dependents receive Evacuation Orders and should evacuate to the designated Safe Haven Area (which will be communicated beforehand, usually 200-250 miles). If they stay outside of the Safe Haven, they will be reimbursed at the standard "Rest of US" rate, which is generally lower than the Safe Haven rate. Similarly, mileage reimbursement will not exceed what would have been paid to and designated safe haven area. All personnel and dependents are expected to find their own accommodations within the Safe Haven Area; TRACEN does not make hotel reservations.

Save receipts for expenses of \$75.00 and over and all motel/hotel receipts (even I funder \$75.00). Hotel/motel receipts must be itemized (hotels.com receipts are not acceptable). Meals are reimbursed at a fixed daily rate, so receipts for meals are not required.

Each authorized evacuated traveler is entitled to a daily per diem rate (actual lodging cost + Meals and Incidentals (M&IE), dependents under 12 receive only 50% of the daily M&IE rate.



The **Fire Department** "Coast Guard Fire" responds to 911 calls on base and off base. The Fire Department oversees housing and base fire alarm inspections. They offer complementary car seat installations and hold a fire safety week every year early in the fall.

The **Police Department** protects life, property, individual rights, and performs law enforcement at the training center. The department conducts bicycle safety classes, motorcycle safety, and advanced rider course. The Police Department hosts an annual TRACEN Public Safety Day, and assists various local
